

Robert M. McDowell

The Honorable Robert M. McDowell was nominated by President George W. Bush to a seat on the Federal Communications Commission on Feb. 6, 2006. He was unanimously confirmed by the U.S. Senate on May 26, and sworn in as Commissioner on June 1, 2006.



Comm. McDowell brings to the FCC approximately 16 years of private-sector experience in the communications industry. Before joining the FCC, Comm. McDowell was Senior Vice President and Assistant General Counsel for COMPTEL, an association representing competitive facilities-based telecommunications service providers, emerging Internet phone providers, integrated communications companies, and their suppliers.

Prior to joining COMPTEL in 1999, Comm. McDowell served as the Executive Vice President and General Counsel of America's Carriers Telecommunications Association (ACTA), which merged with COMPTEL at that time.

Comm. McDowell graduated *cum laude* from Duke University in 1985. After serving as chief legislative aide to a member of the Virginia House of Delegates, he attended the Marshall-Wythe School of Law at the College of William and Mary. Upon his graduation, he joined the Washington, D.C., office of Arter & Hadden, a national law firm based in Cleveland.

Extensively involved in civic and political affairs, Comm. McDowell has served on numerous boards and commissions. He resides in Fairfax County, Va., on the farm where he grew up, with his wife, Jennifer, and their two children.

Decker Anstrom

Decker Anstrom is President and Chief Operating Officer of Landmark Communications, Inc. in Norfolk, Va., a position he has held since 2002. He also serves as Chairman of The Weather Channel, which is owned by Landmark. Mr. Anstrom had been President and Chief Executive Officer of The Weather Channel in Atlanta since 1999. Mr. Anstrom previously served as President and Chief Executive Officer of the National Cable Television Association (NCTA) in Washington, D.C. He joined NCTA in 1987 and served as Executive Vice President before becoming President and CEO in 1994. From 1978 to 1981, Mr. Anstrom was an assistant director of the White House Office of Presidential Personnel, handling presidential appointments to the Cabinet and other senior political posts. Prior to this position, he was a senior staff member in the Office of Management and Budget. Mr. Anstrom graduated with a Bachelor's degree from Macalester College in St. Paul, Minn., where he was a member of Phi Beta Kappa. He also attended the Woodrow Wilson Graduate School of Public and International Affairs at Princeton University.

HONOREE

Glenn A. Britt

Glenn A. Britt was named President and Chief Executive Officer of Time Warner Cable in February 2006 and has served as its chief executive since 2001. Mr. Britt has been the driving force behind the company's deployment of advanced video services, such as video-on-demand, high-definition television, and digital video recorders. He has also overseen the growth of Time Warner Cable's broadband and digital phone services.



Mr. Britt joined Time Inc. in 1972 and served in various management capacities throughout the 1970s and early '80s. He came to hold key positions with Time Inc. including Vice President (1986), Treasurer (1986), Vice President — Finance (1988), and Chief Financial Officer (1988).

Mr. Britt became Executive Vice President of Time Warner Cable in 1990 and also served as President and CEO of Time Warner Cable Ventures. Mr. Britt was named President of Time Warner Cable in 1999.

Mr. Britt serves on the Board and Executive Committee of the National Cable & Telecommunications Association (NCTA). He is also Chairman of the Board of CableLabs, and serves on the boards of the Walter Kaitz Foundation, the Pearl Harbor Memorial Fund, Xerox Corporation, and the Museum of the Moving Image.

Mr. Britt received a B.A. in economics from Dartmouth College, where he graduated *magna cum laude* in 1971. A member of Phi Beta Kappa, Mr. Britt received an M.B.A. from the Amos Tuck School of Business Administration at Dartmouth in 1972.

Dan Glickman

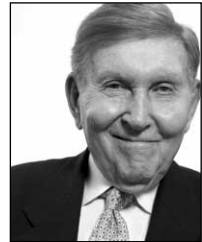
Dan Glickman is Chairman and CEO of the Motion Picture Association of America, Inc. (MPAA), representing the American motion picture, home video, and television industries. Prior to joining the MPAA in 2004, Mr. Glickman was the Director of the Institute of Politics located at Harvard University's John F. Kennedy School of Government. He also served as Senior Advisor to the law firm of Akin Gump Strauss Hauer & Feld in Washington, D.C. Mr. Glickman served as Secretary of Agriculture from 1995 until 2001. In that role, he placed new emphasis on nutrition, food safety, natural resources, civil rights, and export policies while preserving an effective safety net for America's farmers and ranchers. Previously, Mr. Glickman served for 18 years in the U.S. House of Representatives, representing the 4th Congressional District of Kansas. A member of the Agriculture and Judiciary committees, he was involved in farm legislation, general aviation policy, and intellectual property protection. He also chaired the House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence. Mr. Glickman received his Bachelor's degree from the University of Michigan and law degree from George Washington University.

HONOREE

Sumner M. Redstone

Sumner M. Redstone serves as Chairman of the Board of both Viacom and CBS Corporation, roles he assumed after the separation of Viacom into two publicly traded companies in 2005. Mr. Redstone is the controlling shareholder of both companies.



Mr. Redstone had served as Chairman of the Board of Viacom since 1987 and Chief Executive Officer of Viacom since 1996. He has been Chairman of the Board of National Amusements since 1986, and Chief Executive Officer of National Amusements since 1967. Mr. Redstone was President of National Amusements from 1967 to 1999.

Among his many activities in the entertainment industry, Mr. Redstone served as Chairman of the Board of the National Association of Theatre Owners, and currently is a member of its Executive Committee. He is also active in the affairs of numerous civic and philanthropic organizations, particularly those in medicine and the arts.

Mr. Redstone began his career as Law Secretary with the U.S. Court of Appeals, and then served as a Special Assistant to the U.S. Attorney General. He practiced law in Washington, D.C., before joining National Amusements in 1954.

Mr. Redstone graduated first in his class from Boston Latin School. In 1944, he was awarded a degree after studying for two and one-half years at Harvard College. In 1947, Mr. Redstone received his LL.B. from the Harvard University School of Law. Mr. Redstone served in the Military Intelligence Division during World War II.

NATIONAL FREEDOM OF SPEECH WEEK

October 16 – 22, 2006

Now in its second year, National Freedom of Speech Week (NFSW) is a patriotic celebration of freedom of speech and of the press. Tonight's Friends & Benefactors Awards Banquet marks the opening of the 2006 National Freedom of Speech Week, which will be commemorated with programs and special activities by groups around the country.

The goal of National Freedom of Speech Week is to raise public awareness of the importance of free speech and press in our democracy — and to celebrate that freedom. This event is observed during the third week of October every year.

A key element in the success of NFSW is the involvement of "Partnering Organizations," groups that believe in the principle of free expression and are willing to promote it actively during National Freedom of Speech Week.

The number of Partnering Organizations has grown rapidly, from six last year to more than 20 this year. Among the new entrants in 2006 are the law schools and departments of communication of several universities. These Educational Partners, along with allied student groups, are an important link in bringing the NFSW message to tomorrow's leaders.

This year also marks the launch of a Web site devoted solely to National Freedom of Speech Week: www.FreeSpeechWeek.org. We invite our friends to visit this site, and to join in celebrating free speech as "the sound of liberty."

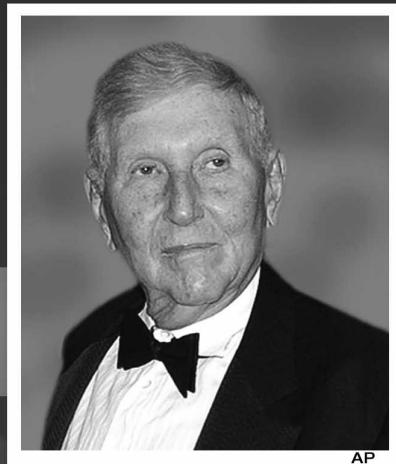
